



Turn to Acts 3 (recalling last sermon): Peter’s sermon reinforcing this scriptural concept of TIMES

Look at (READ) vs 20 and 24 - Peter’s point is two-fold:

- FIRST->we have/are a part of the “times of refreshing”, partake in the blessing of Abram
- SECOND—> prophets proclaimed “these days”

TRANSITION - This morning I want to explore more of the prophets’ proclamation re: THESE DAYS....




Websites today sometimes have a “WORD CLOUD” for most used words  
My own “PROPHETIC WORD CLOUD” — aka “Trigger Words”

TRANSITION: You can probably guess which one we’ll focus on today



This phrase shows up a lot in prophecy - so much, like me, you have to say “hmmmm”  
Technically, I suppose, it’s really part of a larger “genre” (my word) that’s THE DAY OF THE LORD

TRANSITION: I don’t want to get in the weeds on this but just for big picture...



For reference later if you want -- details here aren't critical for now

1. RIGHT — THE CHART: occurrence in the prophets -- shear volume you have to take note
  - Occurs other places and doesn't always mean the same thing!!
  - ex: there are lots of "days of the Lord" as described in scripture (e.g. captivity, some specific punishment, final judgement, etc.)
2. LEFT — THE FOUR PHRASES that focus on the "day" (not literal) that I BELIEVE refer to Christ and His Church/Bride (another trigger word)
  - It is ONE of the "Days of the Lord" (the most according to my calculation)
  - We've looked at Isaiah (some, but you can see there's MUCH more)
  - Jeremiah contains a good concentration

TRANSITION: Today I want to look at both the notables and then some of the concentration that occurs in




...In so doing I have two objectives:

1. Illustrate the harmony of scripture
2. Show the kingdom promises proclaimed beforehand (a la Peter's sermon)

It's interesting what you come across in supposed 'religious' material.

1. Warning on nonsense disguised as "theological experts"
  - Premise -- is VERY TRUE; Suggested reasons? Pretty ignorant
2. Big picture / timeline

TRANSITION: So let's take a quick journey on this timeline to NOTE the PROCLAMATION from some of these prophets....

Amos 9:11-12  
*"In that day I will raise up the booth of David that is fallen and repair its breaches, and raise up its ruins and rebuild it as in the days of old, that they may possess the remnant of Edom and all the nations who are called by my name,"*

## Hosea — — this is too good not to turn to....

Hosea 2:16-19  
*"And in that day, declares the Lord, you will call me 'My Husband,' and no longer will you call me 'My Baal.' ... And I will make for them a covenant on that day with the beasts of the field, the birds of the heavens, and the creeping things of the ground. And I will betroth you to me forever. .... And you shall know the Lord."*

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Jesus prays "that they know you" John's vision in Rev of the Bride (church)

## Isaiah — - we looked at during LS but didn't mention Pau's citation

Isaiah 11:10-12  
*"In that day, the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples—of him shall the nations inquire, and his resting place shall be glorious. In that day, the Lord will extend his hand yet a second time to recover the remnant that remains of his people... He will raise a signal for the nations..."*

**[BUILD] OBJECTIVE #1** — Visualize the harmony of God's word

Let's pause here — — and just look at this compilation of scripture....amazing!!!! Praise God in His unity of revealed word.

Remember this from earlier the "STRIKING LINGUISTIC PARALLELS" explained by some scholars as "prophets borrowed phrases from one another; others hold that they drew more or less from the religious literary traditions" — — NO! It's all from the same source — — the mouth of God!

TRANSITION: But we have one more prophet to look at...so please turn to Zechariah 1...

TRANSITION: We started by looking at Peter's somewhat benign reference to "THESE DAYS" in his sermon in Acts 3....but there's more...

**New Testament too:**

- Peter (Acts 3:24) "And all the prophets who have spoken, from Samuel and those who came after him, also proclaimed these days."
- Paul (1 Cor 10:11) "Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come."
- James (Jms 5:1-3) "Come now, you rich, weep and howl for the miseries that are coming upon you. Your riches have rotted and your garments are moth-eaten... You have laid up treasure in the last days."
- Peter (1 Pet 1:20-21) "He was foreknown before the foundation of the world but was made manifest in the last times for the sake of you who through him are believers in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God."
